Reading paper (non-fiction):

- You need to know AFOREST and be able to identify and explain them in the text given.

- You need to know how to write a PEE. Most questions will ask you to respond in a PEE

P-Point- Answer the question in a full sentence

E- Evidence- Use a quote from the text

E- Explain- Explain what the quote means
